A MESSAGE FROM OUR KAHUNA

According to the author of the first Hawaiian dictionary (1865), “kahuna” is a contraction of “kahu” (to cook, especially in an earth oven) and “ana” (a particle that adds “ing” to a word). So the base meaning by this idea is “a cooking.” This doesn't make much sense until you learn that “kahu” also means “to tend an oven, or to take care of the cooking.” Ancient Hawaiian thought was very symbolic and a word for one type of activity or experience could be applied to other symbolically related activities or experiences. So “kahu,” originally referring to taking care of an oven, became a general word for taking care of anything. A basic translation of “kahuna” would be “a caretaker.” (Serge Kahili King)

I love that the Auction Team entitled this piece by giving me such a grand title; one that I hadn't ever considered until now. Lovely as it is to picture myself leading in warmer climates and with hibiscus abound, I have to say: I'd rather N.J. snow storms, sleeping bag-like winter coats, my Protestant “minister” title, and each one of you.

In the pages that follow, you will see the offerings of many caretakers. Cooks and hosts, artists and childcare providers, vacation homes for replenishment and tours in our backyards.

This congregation has, time and again, shown me what it means to be a caretaker. To show up to do the hard work of taking our spiritual lives seriously and then, with just as much commitment, showing up to have fun! To build relationships; to try something new; and just as important, to offer our financial gifts for the betterment of our community and those we serve.

I am honored to be your minister and love each of you for your kahuna-spirits. May this evening be one of joy and celebration; a little competition and a way to usher in another year of relationships and replenishment.

And, as always, your financial participation in this evening is a gift, a caretaking, of this place and people for which I am grateful. All of this is the spiritual life and I wouldn't want to do it anywhere, or with anyone, else!

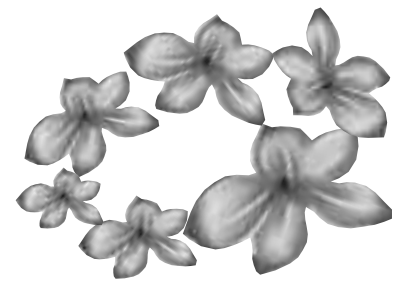

Did you donate an item?

Silent Auction items should be dropped off on Friday, April 21, 7–9 p.m. (room 101), or Saturday, April 22, 9 a.m.–noon. Live Auction items should be dropped off on Friday, May 5, 7–9 p.m. Please contact the auction team to make other arrangements if necessary.

Get Your Live Auction Tickets!

While members enjoy the entire auction process, the Live Auction Night is something to remember. Your ticket covers a great evening of fellowship and an incredible meal, including soda, beer and wine. Tickets are only \$25 for adults, with no charge for children under 12. You can pre-purchase tickets during the Silent Auctions

or at the door on May 6. Free child care is provided during the Live Auction with advanced registration of children.

How it works

Bid on fixed price and competitive bid items on the two Silent Auction Sundays and before the Live Auction begins on May 6. Your bidding strategy may depend on whether you attend the Live Auction. It's always best to join us for the party. If you are not at the Live Auction, we will contact you if you are a winner.

Dates and Times

Sundays, April 23 and 30 – Silent Auctions immediately after each service. Bid on fixed price and competitive bid items. Remember to pay for fixed price items that day. Look for Auction Ambassadors who will help you.

Saturday, May 6 – Live Auction event in the Crossings Room and Sanctuary.

5:00 – Registration and child care opens.

5:00 to 6:30 – Enjoy great food and drink in the Crossings Room, visit the Lobby for the Boutique, bid on fixed price and competitive bid items.

6:15 – Last call for silent bids.

6:30 – Silent bidding closes and dessert begins as we move to the Sanctuary.

7:00 – Live Auction begins!

Event Tips

Not quite sure how to get the items you want in the auction? Here are some tips from veterans.

Before the Live Auction:

- Use your auction book to plan ahead. Mark the items you will go for first.
- Get your bidder number early (see label on your book or at the door).
- Check your calendar in advance for dinner and event dates.
- Watch those silent bid sheets so you don't lose out at the last minute.
- Buy Lottery Dinner tickets for a chance to buy a spot at some great meals that sell out fast.

Want to win a big item? Pull together a team and:

- Agree on your maximum bid.
- Designate one person to bid for your team.
- Pick one payer to settle the account that night.

After the Auction:

- You must settle your auction account May 6th using cash, check or MasterCard/Visa.
Note: credit card fees reduce your donation to UUCWC.
- Take your winnings home that night. (Volunteers must prepare the building for Sunday's service. Let us know if you can help.)
- On the other hand... don't pass up bidding if you want something you can't move that night. We will help you get it home in the next few days.
- Won a service? You'll get a certificate and make your arrangements with the donor. Watch for expiration dates.

Winners will be asked if they accept the purchase. If a bidder decides to not purchase the meal at the fixed price, another lottery ticket will be drawn.

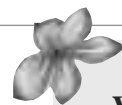
New Members
