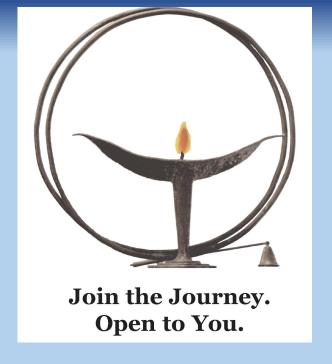

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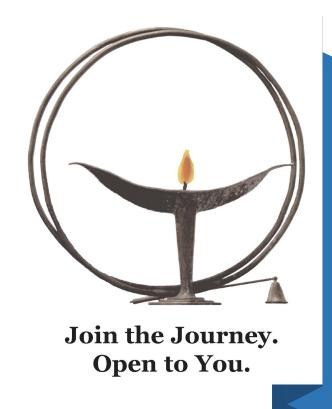

Bank Loan Process

- Rates are very low
- George Faulkner worked with Finance Committee to create financial package
- Financial package being sent to banks
- Banks reaction to our cash flow projection is very positive
- CC pledges extend over the next 3-5 years; loan payment for CC

- Improve kitchen layout and storage change the world: to improve our ability to serve the community and enhance rental opportunities

- Complete necessary construction while restricted from in person gatherings during COVID
- **Phase construction and project completion** to meet the changing needs of how we do church and the work of the church
- Develop plan to install appropriate technology so that next year's live services can also be fully experienced virtually

Q: Timeline?

A: end of Aug / early Sept to break ground, then 4-6 months (tentative) to complete. No contractors hired yet.

Q: More details on loan?

A: Just started discussing; will follow up as this develops.

Q: How will elevator work with social distancing?

A: Not sure. [Building re-opening team to address.]

Q: How many contractors will you interview?

A: Plan is to speak with 5 to 6.

Q: Is elevator only way to enter church?

A: No, walk into church at ground level; you can then take elevator or stairs.

Q: What's elevator capacity?

A: Unknown at this time.
